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Government's Net Revenue Collection: The First 10 Months of Fiscal Year 2024 (October 2023 – July 2024)

Mr. Pornchai Thiraveja, Director General of the Fiscal Policy Office and Spokesperson of the Ministry of Finance, stated that the government revenue collection has consistently improved and there is a clear sign indicating that revenue is reaching the target. Therefore, the Ministry of Finance is confident that the revenue target for fiscal year 2024 can be achieved.

In the first 10 months of fiscal year 2024 (October 2023 – July 2024), the net government revenue collection was 2,211,295 million Baht. The collected revenue from State-Owned Enterprises (SOEs), the Revenue Department, the Customs Department, and the Treasury Department were higher than the target. However, the collected revenue from the Excise Department was affected by the temporary tax cut on diesel and benzene fuel to reduce the burden of energy costs on citizens and entrepreneurs in October 2023 – April 2024. Furthermore, the measure to promote the usage of Electric Vehicles (EV) to support Thailand's transition to a low-carbon society and to become a regional EV manufacturing hub has resulted in lower tax rates. Consequently, the net government revenue collection in the first 1 0 months of fiscal year 2024 was 2 5,259 million Baht or 1.1% lower than the revenue target, slightly improved from the first 9 months of fiscal year 2024. Nevertheless, the revenue from the Excise Department and the overall revenue collection was higher than the same period of the previous fiscal year 13.6% and 3.3%, respectively. After excluding special revenue of 69,475 million Baht from the base, revenue collection was 6.8% higher than the same period of the previous fiscal year.
